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EARLY YEARS: THE FOUNDATION STAGE

The Statutory Framework for The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) provides the guidance and requirements supporting the learning and development of children in our care. The Framework describes the stages for the development of children (from birth to 5 years of age) and how children's health, wellbeing and safety are our priority within an environment that provides opportunities to allow them to reach their true potential.

The EYFS is made up of Three Prime Areas of Learning which are:

- Communication & Language
- Physical Development
- Social and Emotional Development

and Four Specific Areas of Learning which are:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding of the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

The Prime Areas of Learning cover the knowledge and skills which are the foundation for children's school readiness and future progress. These, along with the Specific Areas, provide a holistic approach to learning.

All areas of learning and development are important and are inter-connected.

TEACHING & LEARNING: LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Our approach to teaching and learning will give your child an established start to their education at this crucial stage. In Early Years we begin to lay a firm foundation to each child's development and future learning with a wide curriculum encompassing not only literacy and numeracy skills but a range of other subject areas, including music and sport in Reception.

The benefit of small classes and excellent pupil to teacher ratios means we can focus on teaching within small groups, with clearly differentiated work, to ensure your child is taught at the correct pace for their own ability.

FOREST SCHOOL

Children enjoy our extensive mature grounds and benefit from ready access to a variety of outdoor spaces including a beautiful woodland space where the natural environment is used as an 'outdoor classroom' with our qualified Forest School leader. At Forest School children build independence and confidence by learning a range of skills including den building, making and using tools, and finding and identifying creatures and plants.

OUTDOOR LEARNING

In addition to laying the foundations for future academic achievement, Early Years education is also crucial in developing a range of skills including problem-solving abilities, creativity and physical skills as well as fostering a sense of well-being and discovery. The Council for Learning Outside the Classroom states that these skills and more can be achieved through learning in the outdoor environment.



NURSERY CURRICULUM

Our Nursery provides a happy and nurturing environment in which to prepare your child for life in school and our small classes ensure that he or she receives personal attention at all times.

Our well-equipped and comfortable rooms are the focus for the teaching of early literacy, the Read, Write Inc. (RWI) phonics programme and numeracy as well as the development of physical, social and creative skills. Children are provided with ample opportunity to free flow to our dedicated outdoor learning and play area and once a week Nursery children attend Forest School. We operate a key worker system which allows our team to build a close relationship with each child and their family, enabling us to work closely with parents to plan activities which incorporate children's interests.

Nursery is a fully-integrated part of our School, giving your child the opportunity to benefit from the extensive range of facilities and extra-curricular activities on offer, including Taekwondo, ballet and yoga. By the end of Nursery children are fully prepared for the transition to Reception and take part in a wonderful celebratory graduation ceremony.



TYPICAL NURSERY DAY

A typical day in nursery is action-packed with a range of activities to take part in and enjoy. We offer morning sessions which run from 8am to 1pm and afternoon sessions which run from 1pm to 6pm.

RECEPTION CURRICULUM

Many children progress into our Reception Class from the Nursery, but we also welcome new children to the school at this stage. We encourage taster sessions and where possible visit new children in their nursery settings prior to starting with us.

Our Reception pupils start full time in September, enjoying small class sizes in our bright and colourful classrooms. When your child reaches Reception age, we encourage him or her to begin to learn in a more formal style. Small group teaching and adult-directed activities by highly experienced staff ensure children meet their full potential. We offer a structured, academic based curriculum which includes reading, writing, mathematics, art, music, PE (in the School's purpose-built Sports Hall) and playtime.

Using the phonic knowledge gained in Nursery, the children continue to follow the Read Write Inc. (RWI) programme at an appropriate level. The emphasis in all other areas of learning is still very much based on learning through play, exploration and investigation where the children are encouraged to consolidate their knowledge and skills.

We make full use of our extensive grounds to enhance classroom-based learning. This includes walks to observe seasonal changes, going on treasure hunts, and planting and maintaining the vegetable patch. We organise two trips a year to enrich the curriculum and provide new and engaging learning experiences for the children.
